## **PCHA partners with FAHRO to host Section 3 Compliance Training**

**PINELLAS COUNTY, FLORIDA** – The Pinellas County Housing Authority (PCHA) is hosting a Section 3 Compliance Technical Assistance Training session on behalf of the Florida Association of Redevelopment Officials (FAHRO). This half-day workshop will be held on February 16 at the Authority's central office in Largo and will train attendees on Section 3 regulation and requirements.

The workshops are targeted towards public housing management and procurement staff, municipal housing and community development staff, and contractors doing business with public housing authorities and municipalities.

The purpose of Section 3 compliance is to ensure that employment, training, and other economic opportunities, generated through federal funds, are directed towards recipients of government housing assistance.

The workshops will present information about current Section 3 regulation and proposed changes to the regulation; define requirements for recipients, contractors and architects; present easy compliance methods and success stories; as well as, offer practical compliance solutions.
